## **HOW TO TREAT HEAD AND NECK CANCER IN THE ELDERLY?**

Amsterdam, 10-11 April, 2014





















Since 1993 ten successful AVL multidisciplinary symposia were held on the diagnosis and treatment of malignancies in the head and neck. The forthcoming eleventh symposium is focused on head and neck cancer in the elderly.

Sixty percent of all malignancies are diagnosed in patients who are over 65 years of age and the number of elderly patients will significantly increase for the forthcoming decennia in the Western hemisphere. In these patients individualized treatment is of utmost importance, because of the high incidence of comorbidities - with a related use of multiple drugs -, declined (multiple) organ functions and less optimal psychosocial functioning. This means that the use of standardized treatment protocols is limited in the older age group, requiring adaptations for almost every treatment modality. Also the application of the full armamentarium of highly technical diagnostic measures might be questioned in this specific patient population, particularly from a cost effectiveness point of view.

The adequate diagnosis and treatment of head and neck cancer in the elderly is strongly dependent on a multidisciplinary approach with active participation of various medical specialists. This symposium brings pitfalls in the diagnostic process and multimodality treatment to the attention of the participants. Case report discussions are included as well as how to implement the acquired knowledge.

Lectures and presentations aim at an adequate information on current advances and state of the art of diagnosis and treatment of head and neck cancer.
